#### Report of the Board President:

Dr. Matarazzo congratulated the school board candidates re-elected November 5, 2019 each for 3-year terms: Jason Kim, John Mattessich and Thomas Matarazzo. Also, congrats to the Football Booster Club for another successful fundraiser.

A moment of silence was conducted for Anthony "Willie" Sambogna, a former 2-term Palisades Park Councilman and an advocate for education.

Dr. Matarazzo welcomed the AP History students in attendance.

#### Report of the Superintendent:

Dr. Cirillo introduced Police Captains Anthony Muccio and Anthony Albanese. They spoke to the Board regarding the appointment of an SRO (School Resource Officer) who will begin working in the school district tomorrow, November 21, 2019.

Dr. Cirillo announced 2 monetary awards from the Korean Consulate of NY. Lindbergh Elementary School and the Jr/Sr High School will receive \$6,000. 00 each.

December 2<sup>nd</sup> all 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6th grade students will participate in the First Annual Spelling Bee. Winners will be announced at the next Board meeting (12/18). They will represent our district on January 7·2020 at Bergen Community College.

The Annual Uniform MOA between the Board and the Local Police Department will be acted on under New Business, and then forwarded to the County and State DOE's.

The referendum was defeated at the November general election. Dr. Cirillo is reaching out to the Mayor, the Borough Administrator, and the Buildings & Grounds Committee to develop a new plan of action.

There are 3 dates in the future at which to hold a "special" election – January, March and June 2020. The referendum can be presented again to the voters of Palisades Park.

## Report of the Board Attorney:

The Negotiations Committee is still working on the PPEA agreement. A mediation is scheduled on November 26<sup>th</sup>. A MOU has been drafted on the Administrator's contract. 2 matters involving out-of-district student placements will be discussed in closed session. One matter will be acted on the open session for a proposed monetary settlement.

## **Audience Participation:**

Neris Papoters, Resident/Parent, expressed dismay over the failure of the Referendum to pass at the November 5<sup>th</sup> election. She felt as if the Board members did little or nothing to support the passage of the Referendum. School buildings are still in need of repairs, classes are overcrowded and not fully equipped. Board members should have been present at the polling districts to show support.

Maureen Tansey, Resident – can the Referendum be addressed again in the future? Dr. Cirillo – Yes. 60 days' notice is required to propose a Special election ballot. There can be a question to address repairs/renovations only and no expansion to the school buildings, or 2 questions can be proposed addressing both repairs/renovations and expansion. That would be up to the Board members.

Cathy Doheny, employee – When could a Special election be proposed? The second Tuesday in Marcy 2020 or June 2, 2020. A Special election can cost upwards to \$20,000.00.

Maureen Tansey, Resident – December  $5^{th}$  parent/teacher conferences at the high school between the hours of 6:00-8:00 p.m. The school in need of a Korean translator that evening. Stephanie Jang volunteered to assist.

Several Board members addressed the Referendum – R. Lee, S. Jang, J. Mattessich, E. Min and T. Yang. They all spoke in favor of proposing a future question/questions on an election ballot.

Mr. Yang expressed dismay at seeing all the signs posted during the November 5<sup>th</sup> election cycle stating: "Vote NO on the Referendum". Those signs promoted a very negative message to the voters of Palisades Park.
