### Report of the Superintendent:

The district performed an internal audit for the annual HIB self-assessment. All 3 of our schools have increased the number of programs/assemblies related to harassment, intimidation and bullying prevention. Our rating last year was 71 & 72. We have increased our rating this year to 72 & 73. 77 is the maximum rating a district can achieve. The Board will vote on the submission of the HIB self-assessment under New Businss.

Lindbergh School and the High School were recipients of the BCUA Environmental Award. Each school received \$1,000. for their participation in environmental projects.

On October 20<sup>th</sup> the high school will host 20 students from South Korea. They will tour our facilities and interact with staff and students.

### **Audience Participation:**

Maria Pesantes, parent/resident, commented on a third member of the CST staff resigning. This is a very disturbing scenario in an area dealing with some of the district's most vulnerable students.

Lindbergh School secretary appointed as a co-advisor to the Student Council? Dr. Cirillo responded that if the position does not interfere with their contractual obligations than there is no conflict.

Does the school district have an agreement with the Borough for snow removal? Dr. Cirillo responded that the Borough's main focus is the roads. The newly purchased truck will be used primarily for areas surrounding the 3 school buildings.

Damien Lambertis, former student/graduate, thanked the Board for allowing him to sponsor a basketball fundraiser at the high school gymnasium. He was able to raise \$1,200 for the district's scholarship fund.

Lisa Ardire, parent/resident, recommended that the Board consider hiring a retired police officer to assist in checking the residency of incoming students. Dr. Cirillo commented that the district is required to offer an education to all resident students. The school district does not police the apartment buildings or housing situations of incoming students. Only that they provide proof that they are residing in Palisades Park. The Board does employ a residency officer.
