Note:

P.L. 2010, c.122 concerning harassment, intimidation, and bullying in school settings, amended various parts of the statutory law and supplements N.J.S.A. 18A:37-13 et seq. and

chapter 3B of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. It created the "Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act" which is contained in N.J.S.A. 18A: 37-13 through N.J.S.A. 18A:37-32.

N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14, as amended by P.L. 2010, c.122 section 11, defines "harassment, intimidation or bullying" to include "any gesture, written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication, whether it be a single incident or a series of incidents, that is reasonably perceived as being motivated either by any actual or perceived characteristic, such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic, that takes place on school property, at any school-sponsored function, on a school bus, or off school grounds that substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students.

HVAC Bid Recommendations from <u>Parette Somjen</u>, the district's architects, were submitted to the Superintendent and the Business Administrator.

The HVAC project will address new school boilers, air-conditioning and pipe replacement. The upgrades came in below budgeted costs. The projects will be funded by federal grant money and capital outlay.

The submitted bid recommendations are tabled for further review by the Board's Attorney.

The Board President opened the meeting to audience participation. Dr. Cirillo will respond to all questions at the end of the public

Audience Participation:

- Mrs. Rivera inquired about uniformity in teaching in the same grade levels. Why some students are more advanced than others in the same subject areas?
- Mrs. Papoter inquired about the high school auditorium, and if it is now available for use? She
 thanked the Board for its transparency and for responding to questions from the public. She also
 asked that the public support the PTA during its membership drive.
- Mr. Rivera asked that the traffic cones be removed on Palisades Blvd adjacent to Lindbergh School. They present a driving hazard. Also, the lowest bid submitted for a project may not necessarily be the best.
- Joe Sperlazzo has worked in the district for 32 years. Would like to be included in the boiler repair/replacement project, so that he can offer a "hands-on" opinion on any new equipment and materials.
- Mrs. Ramos parent of a student at the ECC. Children are struggling with the reading program. She inquired about the possibility of reinstating a phonics-based curriculum for new readers.
- Mrs. Halic concerned about inconsistencies in the curriculum in same grade classrooms. Also,
 a leave replacement teacher at Lindbergh School. Parents were not notified of the change.
- Question from a parent on whether Health/Sex Curriculum will be age appropriate.

Dr. Cirillo:

- Students learn on many different levels. There is a strong presence of multi-lingual students, and the district must address learning curves according to a student's learning capacity.
- Clean bill of health for the high school auditorium. Asbestos abatement has been completed.
- Dr. Cirillo will contact the police department regarding traffic cones. The board does not employ crossing guards or traffic officers. That is the responsibility of the Borough.
- Parette Somjen, Architects said they did attempt to contact Mr. Sperlazzo, but were unable to reach him.
- Dr. Cirillo will inquire regarding why parents were not notified about the teacher replacement for a maternity leave.
- Dr. Cirillo will follow up with the State DOE about the possibility of reinstating a phonicsbased curriculum.
- Heath/Sex education will be taught at an age-appropriate level. Parents do have the right to opt their child out of a program.
